TOUR PROGRAM

On Friday, depart U.S.A. for Warsaw.

2nd Day/Sat - WARSAW. After arrival, check into your hotel in the heart of the city. At 6:00 PM, meet your guide and the rest of the group in the hotel lobby. Drive along the beautifully renovated Royal Route with its historical monuments. Stop for a short walk through Old Town before a welcome dinner with typical Polish dishes and famous Polish vodka, "Zubrowka". [Dinner]

3rd Day/Sun - WARSAW. This morning, we introduce you to the highlights of Warsaw. A half-day sightseeing tour includes Old Town, beautifully rebuilt after World War II with impressive Royal Castle, seat of Polish kings. Continue your tour with a drive through the former Warsaw Ghetto, National Opera House and Town Hall. After lunch afternoon is free. This evening, take a musical journey through the world famous compositions of Frederick Chopin, at a piano recital. [Breakfast, Lunch]

4th Day/Mon - WARSAW-Czestochowa-Auschwitz-KRAKOW. After breakfast, depart for the medieval city of Krakow. En route, stop in Czestochowa to visit the Jasna Gora Monastery and the Black Madonna Shrine with its miraculous icon. After lunch, drive to Auschwitz-Birkenau to visit the Martyrdom Museum of the former Nazi concentration camp, a grim reminder of the Holocaust. Evening is free. [Breakfast, Lunch]

5th Day/Tue - KRAKOW - Wieliczka. This morning's city tour features Wawel Hill with the Royal Castle, home to three dynasties of Poland's monarchs. Tour the Wawel Cathedral where Polish kings were crowned and buried. Walk to the medieval Market Square, one of the largest in Europe. At St. Mary's Basilica see the largest wooden altar and at the arcaded Cloth Hall you can shop for souvenirs. After lunch on your own, drive to the renowned Wieliczka salt mines (45 min.). On a 2 mile tourist route you will discover underground wonders carved from salt by generations of miners. [Breakfast]

6th Day/Wed - KRAKOW-ZAKOPANE. This morning, you will visit the former Jewish Quarter of Kazimierz established in 1335. Soon it became one of the European centers of Jewish culture with its own Town Hall, sacral places and market square lined with multitude of small businesses and restaurants. After lunch on your own depart for Zakopane, Poland's most popular vacation resort, beautifully situated at the foot of the soaring Tatra Mountains. [Breakfast]

7th Day/Thu - ZAKOPANE. Start the day with a sightseeing tour of Zakopane were wooden architecture blends with the natural landscapes. Visit the famous Jaszczurowka Chapel and the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Fatima built by the local "Gorale". Admire the breathtaking views of the Tatras from the top of Gubalowka Mountain and shop for souvenirs of arts and crafts of the Highlanders. Enjoy afternoon at leisure. [Breakfast]

8th Day/Fri - ZAKOPANE-Wadowice-WROCLAW. Today depart for western Poland and the historic city of Wroclaw known as "Venice of the North" situated on the Odra River. En route, stop in Wadowice, the birthplace of St. John Paul II and visit the parish church where Karol Wojtyla was baptized. After lunch at a local restaurant continue to Wroclaw for overnight. [Breakfast, Lunch]

9th Day/Sat - WROCLAW-POZNAN. After breakfast, get acquainted with Wroclaw's Gothic monuments, the beautiful Gothic Town Hall, Wroclaw University including Ostrow Tumski dating back to the Middle Ages. From here, drive to Poznan for dinner and overnight. [Breakfast, Dinner]

10th Day/Sun - POZNAN-TORUN. Before departing for Torun take a short sightseeing tour of the historic city of Poznan, cradle of the Polish nation dating back to the 9th century when the first ruler of Poland baptized the country and founded first church. The landmark of the city is the Renaissance Town Hall adorned by the medieval clock where every noon two metal goats butt their heads 12 times. After lunch in a local restaurant continue to Torun for overnight. [Breakfast, Lunch]

11th Day/Mon - TORUN-GDANSK. This morning, you will see the highlights of Torun, birthplace of Polish astronomer, Nicolaus Copernicus, considered one of the most magnificent historic cities of Poland. Its Old Town has been included in UNESCO's list for its impressive 13th century Town Hall, superb churches and historic streets preserving Torun's past glory. After lunch in a local restaurant drive to the Baltic Coast and catch a glimpse of the Old Town on a short walk. [Breakfast, Lunch]

12th Day/Tue - GDANSK-Gdynia-Sopot. Start the day with a tour of medieval Gdansk. Through the city's former fortifications enter the Long Market with magnificent facades where the richest burghers once lived in city's prosperous past. It's famous landmark is the Artus Court and the Neptun's Fountain. St. Mary's Basilica is the largest brick Gothic church in Poland. From here drive to Gdynia, youngest port, and visit Oliwa Cathedral famous for its pipe organ. Continue to Sopot, the fashionable seaside resort with luxury SPA hotels and the longest wooden pier on the Baltic. Rest of the day is free to relax or shop for amber souvenirs in abundance here. [Breakfast]

13th Day/Wed - GDANSK-OLSZTYN. After breakfast, time at leisure. After lunch on your own, depart for Olsztyn, a city located in a region of lakes and forests. In the evening, enjoy a picnic-style dinner with a folklore entertainment in Gietrzwald. [Breakfast, Dinner]

14th Day/Thu - OLSZTYN-Olsztynek-Lowicz-WARSAW. On our way to Warsaw, stop in Olsztyn for a short tour of the city and continue to the Ethnographic Park in Olsztynek, site of the open-air museum of the 19th century village. Before reaching Warsaw you are invited to a home-hosted dinner by a Lowicz couple. You will be welcomed in a typical Polish way, with bread and salt, experience Polish hospitality and talk about their daily life. Overnight in Warsaw. [Breakfast, Dinner]

15th Day/Fri - WARSAW. After breakfast, termination of tour services. [Breakfast]

ABOUT POLAND

POLAND is situated in a very central part of Europe and covers an area of 121,733 square miles - comparable to that of the state of New Mexico. It is the seventh largest country in Europe. Administratively the country is divided into 16 voivodships (states) and has a population of about 36 million.

CLIMATE: Poland is situated in a zone of moderate climate with a considerable influence of sea climate along the Baltic seacoast belt. The climate resembles that of New England. Normal seasonal clothing is adequate but a warmer garment should be included. Comfortable shoes are a must. Weather is extremely unpredictable. Always check weather predictions one week before departure.

CURRENCY: There is no limit to the amount of foreign currency that may be brought into the country. Polish monetary unit is Zloty divided into 100 groszy. 1 dollar = about 4 zloty.

It is suggested you take mostly cash to exchange in places called KANTOR. Also ATM machines are available in major cities.

ELECTRICITY: 220v/50 cycles. All-purpose transformer and 2-prong adapter is required for U.S. appliances.

TIME: Six hours ahead of U.S. Eastern Daylight Time. The 24-hour clock is used.

CREDIT CARDS: VISA, Master Charge and American Express credit cards are accepted in major shops, restaurants, hotels and night-clubs. Discover card is not accepted. Also AX card is not widely used.

STORE HOURS: With the exception of food stores, shops are open between 10/11:00 am and 6/7:00 pm. Grocery stores between 8:00 am-7:00 pm. On Saturdays, most shops are opened until 2:00 pm except department stores which usually close at 7:00 pm. On Sundays, most stores and malls are closed except for souvenir shops. (subject to change)

TIPPING: Not obligatory, but appreciated. Cab drivers and waiters accept between 10-15%. There is also a nominal charge for use of public rest rooms.

TOUR CONDITIONS

RESERVATIONS/PAYMENTS: A deposit of \$250 per person is required at the time of booking. Full payment is due 60 days before departure.

TOUR COST: Tour price is based on currency exchange levels in effect in 2024. It is subject to adjustment in the event of significant changes. **Children discounts:** Children 7 - 11 years old receive 20% discount of the total tour price when sharing room with parents. Children under the age of seven are not accepted on motor coach tours.

TOUR/AIR ARRANGEMENTS: Every effort will be made to provide lowest possible airfare available at the time of booking.

Hotel accommodations will be provided in twin bedded rooms with private bath or shower. Single rooms are available at the supplement shown. While every effort will be made to provide sharing of accommodations for persons booking alone, when requested, it cannot be guaranteed and single supplement must be paid before departure when requested. Triple rooms are not available except for children under 11 yrs. Hotels specified can be changed within the same category.

Unused hotel accommodations or any other unused features of this tour are not refundable nor exchangeable for other services. The right is reserved to substitute hotels and sightseeing features if it becomes necessary. No refund is given for late arrivals or if you miss your flight.

Each tour member must be able to get on and off the motor coach unaided and not require walking devices or wheelchairs. Due to strict traffic regulations, motor coaches are not able to drop tourists directly at the site to be visited. Many streets are pedestrian only with often uneven surfaces. You must be prepared to walk and climb stairs. We regret we cannot provide individual assistance to a tour member for walking, or getting on/off motor coaches.

NOT INCLUDED IN THE TOUR COST: Transfers on arrival and departure, ETIAS fee, if applicable, baggage handling, beverages with meals, cost of passports, items of a personal nature; laundry, travel insurance, gratuities to escorts and drivers.

BAGGAGE: One piece of luggage per person is allowed. Make sure your airfare includes one piece of luggage not exceeding 50 lbs. and 62 in. (sum of three sides). One carry-on bag is free of charge.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: A valid U.S. or foreign passport is required. To apply for passport, contact your local U.S. Post Office. Your passport must be valid for at least three months after your return date.

VACCINATIONS: No vaccinations are required.

CANCELLATIONS: All cancellations must be made in writing to PAT TOURS. Full refund of LAND tour will be made for cancellations received up to 55 days prior to departure less a \$25 administrative fee. Between 55 - 35 days before departure, 50% of the tour cost is non refundable. No refund will be made for cancellations received less than 35 days prior to departure. AIRLINE TICKETS, when issued, are subject to the airline cancellation policy. After completion of the tour, claims for refund must be made in writing within 30 days.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: Travel insurance with coverage for (trip cancellation, emergency medical, baggage delay, and trip delay) is recommended and will be offered to all tour participants with confirmation. If you have a pre-existing condition, insurance must be purchased at the time of deposit. Insurance premium is non-refundable once purchased.
